

ART

PAINTING: Discover new techniques to better yourself as a painter. We will explore colour theory, the process of paint application, and how to create a variety of different textures in our work. Many different types of paint will be explored.

SCULPTURE: Become an artist that works in the third dimension! In this class, you will learn all about different types of sculpture, while trying out lots of different materials and techniques. We will be working with everything from clay to cardboard

DRAWING : Learn new techniques to bring your drawings to life! You will become a master at shading, crosshatching, and drawing what you see. We will be using a large-variety of subject matters to expand your horizons and to challenge your artistic capabilities.

DIGITAL MEDIA

VIDEO EDITING & PRODUCTION: In this class, we will take raw video, youtube clips, pictures and sound clips and use iMacs and the program iMovie to create digital masterpieces such as newscasts, commercials, movie trailers, music videos and stop motion videos. Students will learn how to edit their video and put it together, all while using the new iMacs. This option aligns with the CTF Design Studies courses students can take in high school.

GRAPHIC DESIGN : Using online graphic design sites such as Pixlr and Canva we will create logos, magazine covers, billboard/magazine ads, movie posters, websites, and brochures. Students will be able to integrate their own photos and their own personality into the work they create. This option aligns with the CTF Design Studies courses students can take in high school.

DRAMA

DRAMA : Drama encourages students to explore a variety of dramatic roles and develop a range of dramatic skills while being independent and in small groups. Students will explore the craft of acting that involves exercises, scene work and theatre games designed to develop performance skills and technique. Monologues and short skits will be performed during this term. The development of interpersonal skills, self-confidence and a positive self-image are a strong focus.

DRAMA PRODUCTION : Students will get a chance to study characters, scenes, and will be part of a production. As a class we will put together a whole school production. Set and costume design, memorizing lines and becoming a character on stage will be roles for students in this option. Exercises on becoming a character and developing a production will take place prior to starting the play. The development of interpersonal skills, self-confidence and a positive self-image will also be a focus in this term

FILM STUDIES : This is a course for those who love to watch, discuss and critique movies of all types and genres. In addition to watching movies, students are expected to complete questions, participate in discussions, design and produce a movie poster, review professional movie reviews, and create a movie review of their own. Movies will be rated G, PG and some rated PG 13/14. Parental permission will be required for this option.

FOODS

THE IRON CHEF : This Home Economics foods oriented course is for the truly creative. As seen on TV, groups will get a platter of ingredients each week, and it will be up to the group to decide what they will make with the ingredients they are given. Students will participate in challenges for extra ingredients, and they will also manage a budget throughout the course for days when they need to buy extra items. Sabotaged cooking experiences and opportunities for culinary creativity will make each week an exciting adventure

THE IRON CHEF – Food Truck Feast In this Home Economics Foods Oriented course, students will have the chance to cook a variety of dishes that are found in the food truck circuit. Students will cook a variety of dishes from creative appetizers to delicious desserts, all inspired by successful food truck companies. Students will also have the opportunity to design their own food truck creations.

THE IRON CHEF – BBQ Blitz Do you love the taste of food fresh off the grill? Does the smell of a neighbor's barbecued meal make your mouth water? If you like the taste of freshly barbecued meals, then this option is for you. In this course, we will make our own marinades, grill a variety of meat dishes, try our hand at foil recipes and even make some grilled pizzas. Throughout the course, students will learn how to safely use a BBQ to create delicious meals fresh off the grill.

FORENSICS

Interested in solving puzzles? Wondering how people get caught when they break the law? This option will look at Crime Scene and Eyewitness Basics, Power of Evidence (fingerprinting, handwriting analysis, impression evidence, hair and fibres, etc.), blood basics, Fire Science and CRASH scene forensics. This option is based on lab work, videos, mysteries and science.

SPORTS

FLOOR HOCKEY : Students in this class will have the opportunity to get their fill of the game they love to play in P.E. but do not have the opportunity to play because of limited space. Participants in this option will be graded on the basis of participation, effort and sportsmanship. Students will be allowed to bring their own stick if they want, but are not required to.

BADMINTON: As physical education classes grow the opportunity to play badminton in physical education class becomes more difficult. This class allows students who love the game to get their fix. This class not only includes playing the game, but also understanding the rules and etiquette, as well as learning different types of strategy. Students will have the opportunity to play in both individual and team situations. Students will be graded on class participation, effort and sportsmanship

EDMONTON RIVER VALLEY ACTIVITIES : Students enrolled in this option will have the opportunity to experience a number of physical activities that they may not typically do, combined with some more traditional leisure activities. Some of the activities included in this option are: Canoeing, Biking in the Edmonton river valley, Indoor rock climbing, Archery, Underwater hockey, Stand up paddle boarding, Longboarding, **Students will be required to have a working bike and helmet.**

Material fee for this project is \$40.00.

WOODWORKING – CO2 Cars Do you enjoy racing and designing your own vehicles? Do you enjoy working with woodworking equipment? Well you can do all three with this option. We will be making CO2 dragsters using the woodworking equipment in the shop. What is even better is that you will get to test the performance of your vehicle using roll tests and full power racing using CO2 cartridges.
