Old Business Items (Chair):

Treasurer's Report (Hannah):

1. Report included in email: Update on hotdog sales. Money raised from the Halloween dance. Monthly update of the account, and quick note that the 50/50 is up and running.

Playground Update (Kelly):

1. Playground Fundraising update: The Dance went very well, a lot of work went into the planning and it ran very smoothly. The ticket system was fantastic, supported by Hannah and I taking cash in the kitchen for those who hadn't bought tickets. The attendance numbers were very low in comparison to previous years, maybe 30% attendance. This elevated any lineups in the concession, but meant sales were low.

Craig at No frills saved the day with a large donation of 600 juice boxes, bags of chips, hot dogs and buns.

Valmart - 600 freezies.

Tims near the high school 1000pcs tim bits, which we made into bags of 5.

Safeways - 160 hot dogs

Coop - 90 hot dogs

Ca Tire - 10 helium balloons and 2 flats of gatorade.

Hannah - 4 flats of gatorade

We took \$1,646.50, minus \$300 for DJ. Total profit of \$1,346.50. Great news that we have enough leftovers for the next hot dog day, so this will double our profits.

2. Hot Dog Day: sales were at the lowest ever in Feb, hopefully higher numbers tomorrow on St Paddy's Day. Only need to purchase 25 packs of bread buns, so the cost for tomorrow's hot dog day will be approx. \$65.
3. Spring 50/50: launched last Thursday ready for the floor hockey tournament. Within the first 24hr we had \$700 in sales, only 2 sales over the weekend, then jumped up to \$1,150 after last night's email blast to those who have signed up to receive fundraising emails. 1053 tickets sold, only 30 people bought tickets. Hopefully more

people will purchase tickets within the next 9 days, previous lowest sales were 182, highest 367. In previous years we have been around \$7,000 - \$12,255. Using Zeffy which is 100% free, Raffle box charges 7% of total sales, plus 3% and \$0.03 card fees per transaction.

4. Playground install not commencing until June. They estimate a 3 week install. If the park is not completed before the end of school, we will have a grand opening in Sept.

Bake sale and Popcorn Update (Kyla and Terri):

1. Bake sale Update: Bake sale this month was provided by Grade.5 families. We had enough goodies for a one-day sale. Grade.5's had a field trip the same day, so a sale was held after lunch time for them. A big thank you to Mindy, Shantel, Sharon and Donavin for helping us out with that. Close to \$500 was raised to go towards the grade.5 classrooms.
2. Popcorn Update: February's sale - sold 283 bags of popcorn. Lowest numbers I've seen to date. We still managed to profit \$146.54. Spreadsheet in the shared drive has been updated if anyone would like the detailed breakdown.

The small popcorn bags that we usually order from Harlan's have increased in size (however not price which is good). We will need to adjust the amount of popcorn we are putting in each bag to compensate for the size difference. The remainder of the order has arrived, so we are fully with popcorn and bags.

We would like to thank the school for purchasing a second popcorn machine, this should help with production and hopefully shave down the total time it takes tinpot and bag.

For hot lunch operations, it's going well. We did have quite a few changes and adjustments we had to deal with for the kfc hot lunch on Feb 27th, however we managed and everything got delivered or picked up.

1. Book Fair Update: The Book Fair was a huge success, with a record-high total of over \$11,000 in sales. The after-school portion helped boost our numbers each day. The school will receive Scholastic credit from these sales, which will be used to purchase new books. Multiple prize draws helped engage students across all grades, including the \$25 Family Draw won by Mrs. Milner and one of her students, along with over 30 additional prize winners.
