

## **Absence Reporting**

### GOOD ATTENDANCE PATTERNS ARE AN IMPORTANT FACTOR IN A STUDENT'S OVERALL SUCCESS AT SCHOOL.

#### Report your child absent!

- Log into SchoolMessenger to report your student's absence and advise the reason for absence (ie: Sick, appointment, vacation, etc...) OR
- Call the school. Please leave a detailed message after hours (780-986-7888)

#### Did you know? Key facts about school attendance:

- If your child is 20 minutes late every day, he/she/they will have missed 12 days of instruction by the end of the school year. If your child misses only two days of
- school per month, he/she/they will have missed one month's worth of instruction by the end of the school year. Students who are absent 15 days of school each year
- will have lost one year of instruction by the end of Grade 12. Students who attend school regularly tend to be more engaged in their learning, feel more connected to
- the school and have better academic outcomes than students who miss a lot of school.

#### Families can support good attendance at school by:

- setting a regular bedtime and morning routine;
- getting clothes and backpacks ready the night before;
- encouraging a positive attitude about school;
- communicating regularly with your child's teacher;
- talking with your child about his/her school day;
- taking part in school events and activities to show your child that you value school and education:
- planning vacations and appointments around the school schedule whenever possible;
   and
- making sure your child goes to school unless he/she/they is truly sick.

#### We can help!

Let your school know right away if there is a problem or concern. There are many ways we can work together to get attendance back on track or prevent an attendance problem from starting.

#### SafeArrival - Reporting Student Absences

Dear Parents/Guardians,

To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, we are introducing **a new, more efficient** student absence reporting system called **SafeArrival**. This new system will reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance, make it easy for you to report your child's absence and easy for staff to respond to unexplained student absences.

With **SafeArrival**, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

- On your mobile device:
- Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger Home app from the Apple-App Store or the Google Play Store. Download the app with the following icon:
- The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account.
- Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- Use the SchoolMessenger website:
- Go to the <u>SchoolMessenger website</u>. The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create your account.
- Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.
- By telephone:
- Call the toll-free number **780-955-4526** to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points (email, text, push notification & phone call) until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up.

If you report your child's absence in advance using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications.

Starting **Wednesday August 27, 2025**, please report absences in advance using **SafeArrival** instead of sending notes or calling/emailing the school.

Starting **Wednesday August 27, 2025** staff will begin using the **SafeArrival** notifications to let you know if your student is absent and the absence is unexplained.

Please download the SchoolMessenger Home app or sign into the website before this date. If you are having trouble logging in, please contact your school.

If you do not already receive text message from your school and would like to start, please ensure your school has your mobile phone number and then text "Y" to 978338. (Standard message and data rates may apply.)

Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we implement this new system.
