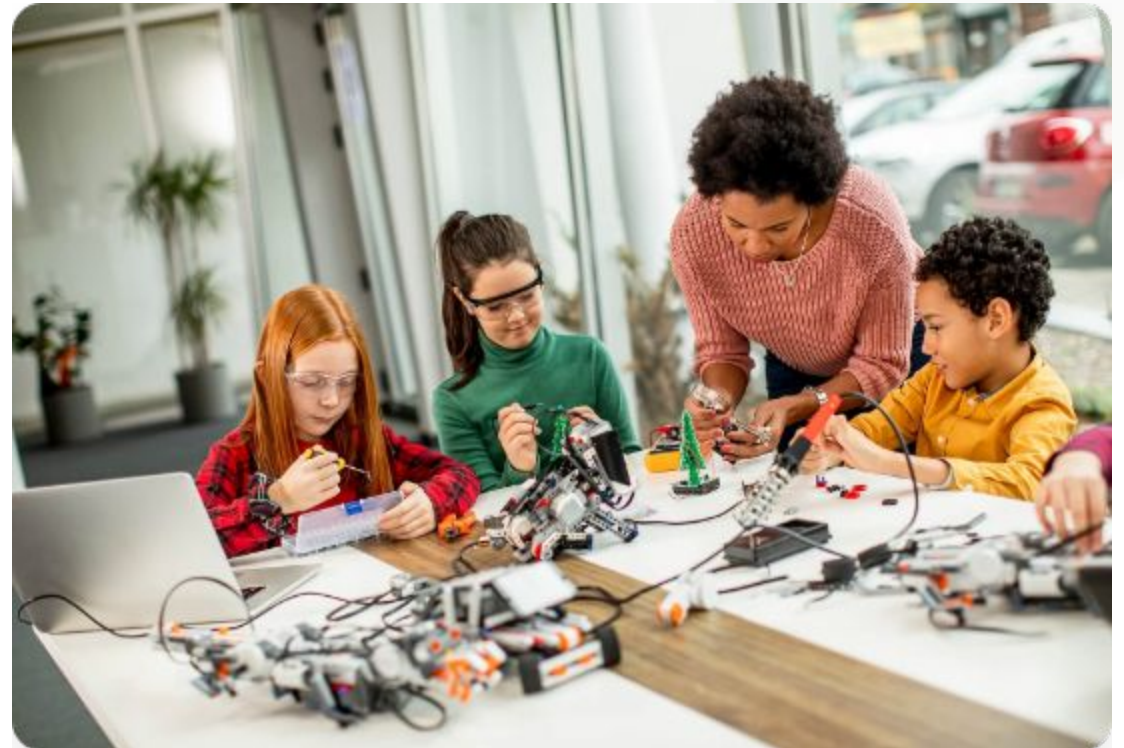

| Introducing CTF (Grades 5, 6, 7)

-  **Student-Centred Exploration** CTF allows students in Grades 5–7 to explore interests and passions while making connections to career possibilities.
-  **Practical Skills** Focuses on hands-on learning through challenges, creating products, and solving real-world problems using industry technology.
-  **Five Occupational Clusters** Business, Communication, Human Services, Resources, and Technology clusters provide a roadmap for diverse learning.



| The Quarter System Explained

Flexible Rotation

The 2026/27 school year is divided into **four distinct quarters**. This structure allows students to sample a wide variety of occupational areas throughout the year rather than sticking to one for the full term.

Weekly Recurrence

Option classes occur every **Tuesday and Thursday**. For specific programs like the Hockey Academy, these sessions recur twice weekly to ensure consistent skill development and instructional momentum.

Cross-Grade Interaction

Classes are strategically split between **Grade 5/6** and **Grade 6/7** cohorts, fostering collaboration between peer groups and ensuring age-appropriate depth in curriculum outcomes.

Continuous Progress

Teachers offer specialized options based on their expertise, with some classes (like Foods or Cosmetology) running in multiple quarters to meet high student demand across the school.

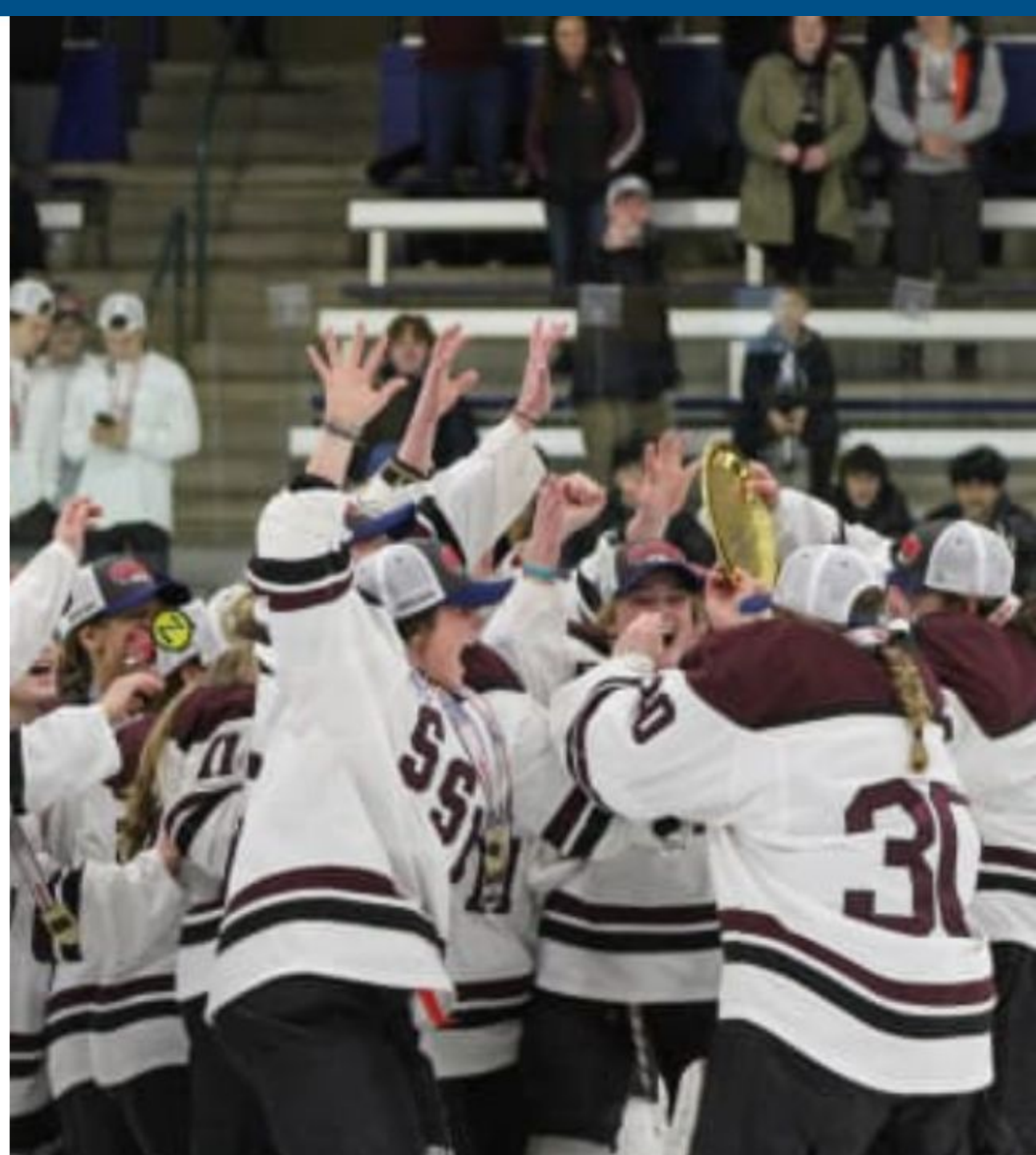
