In an effort to alleviate the larger classes in grade 3, we have hired Mrs. Julia Dobbin and created an additional section of Grade 3. Ms. Alexa Hawkins has also returned to us as an Educational Assistant. We are excited and pleased to welcome both of them back at CPS! At this point, I do not anticipate any further significant changes.

Thank you to all of our parents and students for making our Meet the Teacher and Awards night another spectacular success. It was amazing to see all of the excited student's faces coming into the classrooms to show their families the wonderful things they are learning this year. Students were so excited to introduce their new teachers that there was a lineup outside the school half an hour before we began! In the second half of the evening, we had the great honour of celebrating our upper elementary and junior high students at Awards Night. The gym was filled with clapping and cheering as these students received their well-deserved medals and plaques.

We are very appreciative of the hard work already done by our School Council and we are so happy to have them at the school. The School Council has already met for their AGM and first meeting of the year. These wonderful volunteers put in many hours to ensure that students have amazing opportunities while here at Caledonia Park School. Already we have had volunteers in the school providing Freezies after the Terry Fox Run and doing healthy hair checks. You will also hear from them in the form of Bake Sales, Popcorn Sales and Book Fairs this year, but their support goes so much further than that and we are very grateful for them and all of the work they do. This Thursday, September 28th our school was filled with orange shirts! We wore an orange shirt to honour the Indigenous children who were sent away to residential schools in Canada and to observe Truth and Reconciliation Day (September 30th). The "orange shirt" in Orange Shirt Day refers to the new shirt that Phyllis Webstad was given to her by her grandmother for her first day of school at St. Joseph's Mission residential school in British Columbia. Phyllis was excited to go to school and she loved her bright orange shirt. When Phyllis got to school, they took away her clothes, including her new shirt. It was never returned. To Phyllis, the colour orange has always reminded her of her experiences at a residential school. Orange Shirt Day was a part of activities that took place at our school for Truth and Reconciliation Week.

The fall weather has been beautiful but unfortunately, the current forecast has colder weather around the corner. Please ensure your child is dressed for the weather. In the event we do experience extreme inclement weather, the school has a cold weather policy (-20C), and the students will then remain inside for the recesses on those days (the school will be utilizing weather information from The Leduc Operations Building (<https://www.leduc.ca/about-leduc/weather>)). 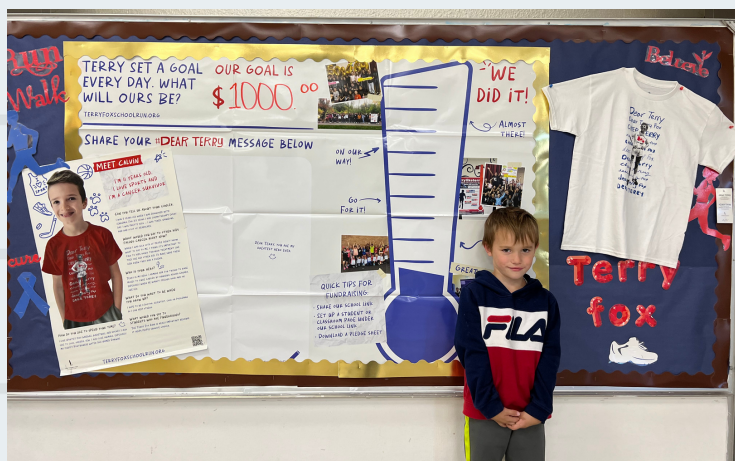


Terry Fox Run/Walk

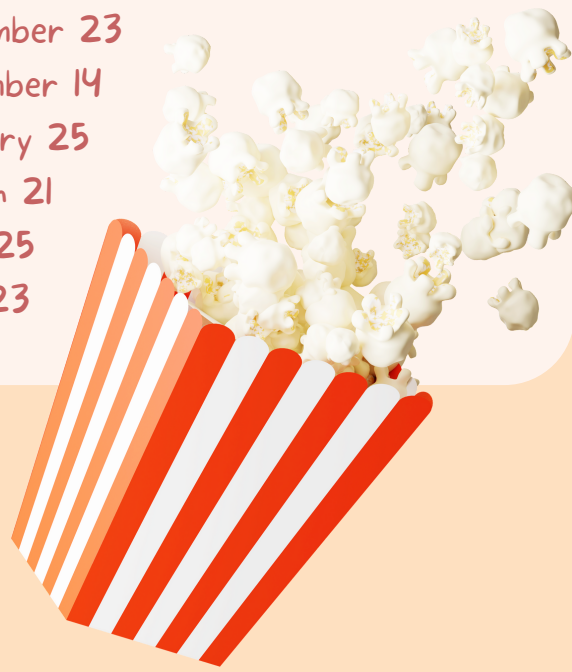
- Items will be priced at \$0.50 each

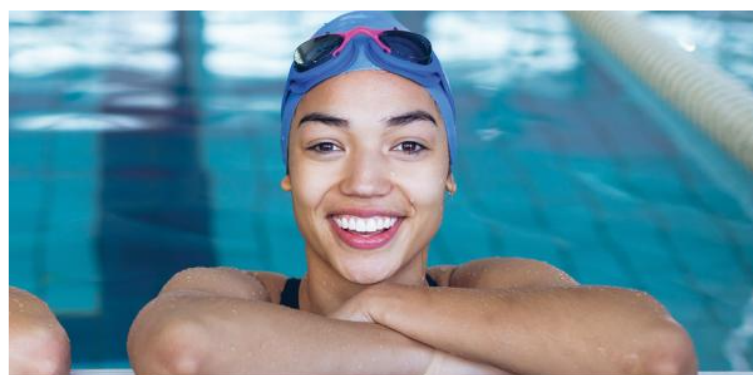

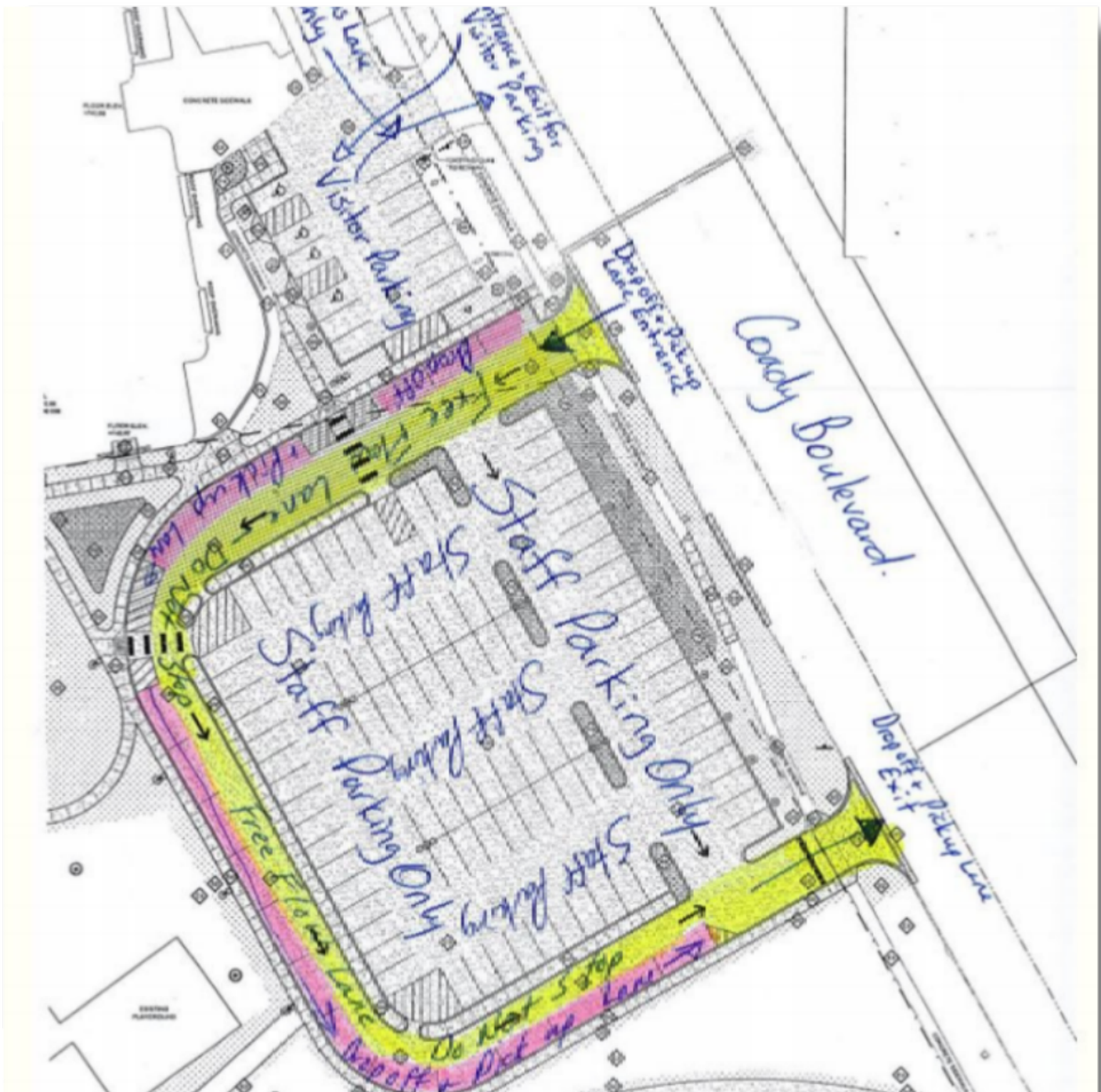

Absence Reporting

GOOD ATTENDANCE PATTERNS ARE AN IMPORTANT FACTOR IN A STUDENT'S OVERALL SUCCESS AT SCHOOL.

Report your child absent!!

- Call the school. *Please leave a detailed message after hours*
- Email the office - cps.studentabsence@blackgold.ca and advise the reason for absence (ie: Sick, appointment, vacation, etc...)

Did you know? Key facts about school attendance:

- If your child is 20 minutes late every day, he/she/they will have missed 12 days of instruction by the end of the school year.
- If your child misses only two days of school per month, he/she/they will have missed one month's worth of instruction by the end of the school year.
- Students who are absent 15 days of school each year will have lost one year of instruction by the end of Grade 12.
- Students who attend school regularly tend to be more engaged in their learning, feel more connected to the school and have better academic outcomes than students who miss a lot of school.

Families can support good attendance at school by:

- setting a regular bedtime and morning routine;
- getting clothes and backpacks ready the night before;
- encouraging a positive attitude about school;
- communicating regularly with your child's teacher;
- talking with your child about his/her school day;
- taking part in school events and activities to show your child that you value school and education;
- planning vacations and appointments around the school schedule whenever possible; and
- making sure your child goes to school unless he/she/they is truly sick.

We can help!!

Let your school know right away if there is a problem or concern. There are many ways we can work together to get attendance back on track or prevent an attendance problem from starting.
